



As we reflect on the past year, I am deeply moved by the generosity of our donors and the dedication of our paramedics, volunteers, and support teams.

Your contributions have played a vital role in saving lives, supporting innovation, and ensuring that every Victorian has access to world-class pre-hospital care. Over the past year we responded to 1,028,393 incidents across Victoria by road and in the air, while our Triage Services team managed 897,771 phone calls. ## The power of donations

Your donations go towards investing in our people, our equipment, our research and our education programs ensuring we can continue delivering the best possible care to Victorians. This includes specialised medical equipment and training resources, advanced training and professional development, and improved access to AFDs statewide.



#### Community funded projects

This year, AV has delivered many incredible projects and initiatives that were only made possible through the generosity of community donations. Thank you for supporting the wonderful work of our people through these projects.

#### First Responder Shock Trial



Every minute without action lowers a person's chance of surviving cardiac arrest by about 10 per cent. In Australia, around 25,000 people die each year from cardiac arrest, when they happen outside of a hospital.

AEDs can increase survival rates when used straight away by bystanders or community volunteers. Unfortunately, only about two per cent of bystanders currently provide defibrillation before emergency crews arrive.

To help change this, AV has been conducting the First Responder Shock Trial (FIRST) - a \$56,000 clinical trial designed to increase early defibrillation rates within the community. The study tests whether providing community volunteer responders with single-use, ultraportable AEDs (about the size of a smartphone) can improve survival outcomes compared to retrieving the nearest available AED.



#### Statewide manikin rollout



These state-of-the-art manikins are fully self-contained units designed to support high-fidelity resuscitation training.

They feature full functionality, including the ability to connect to a mobile device for real-time monitoring and performance evaluation.

The \$1 million statewide rollout of these training manikins ensures that paramedics

and first responders can continue to develop and maintain the patient care skills needed to deliver Best Care with a strong focus on improving cardiac arrest survival and sustaining proficiency in high-risk, lowfrequency skills.



#### Paediatric Distraction Kits



Working with young patients, it is critical to reduce their fear, calm their nerves and help them feel safe during treatment and transport.

Paediatric Distraction Kits, a \$60,000 project, have been rolled out in every ambulance and were made possible with funding from our generous community of donors. Backed by ongoing research and evaluation from Monash University and developed in consultation with industry experts, the kits provide items that are proven to help manage or distract from pain.

Thoughtfully designed with sustainability in mind, these kits have proven highly effective in building trust, easing anxiety, and creating more positive experiences for our younger patients.

#### Your donations go further



Donations from individuals and community partners also supported a range of initiatives, such as:

- Women in ambulance and leadership initiatives to promote diversity and leadership pathways.
- New model of care for chest pain patients trial that supports innovative prehospital assessment tools to reduce unnecessary hospital trips and deliver faster care for high-risk patients.

• New training manikins at the Shepparton branch to support paramedic education.

Research and development projects, pilot programs, and other innovative initiatives, including:

- Medical supplies and equipment.
- Specialised paramedic training.
- AEDs and maintenance in rural and regional Victoria.
- Research and development initiatives.



#### Auxiliary funded projects

AV Auxiliaries have supported their communities for over 100 years, beginning with the first Auxiliary in Maryborough in 1918. Today, around 350 volunteers across more than 40 locations continue this proud tradition.

Auxiliary members play a vital role in strengthening local health services through their fundraising and advocacy efforts. Their commitment, passion, and community spirit have made a lasting impact, and AV is deeply grateful for their ongoing dedication.

Most purchase for their local branch, and on occasions they collaborate on items that will benefit larger areas. Major equipment purchases over the past year have included:

- \$30,000 for a Microsoft Surface Hub to train paramedics and Ambulance Community Officers (ACOs) at Bairnsdale, Sale, Orbost, and Paynesville.
- \$70,000 for AED gifting program supported by Auxiliaries. This program provided 26 AED packages to communities, helping to increase 24/7

access to defibrillators across regional Victoria.

 \$32,000 for simulated patient monitors (Realiti Plus & Realiti 360) that are smart, flexible, and fully integrated simulation systems that deliver realistic, hands-on training. They function as complete in-situ patient monitor simulators with detailed simulated patient records.

These purchases are made possible through the dedicated fundraising efforts of Auxiliary volunteers. Their activities - from trivia nights to raffles - reflect the creativity and commitment of these community groups.

Together, these projects highlight how donor generosity supports innovation, inclusion, and better patient outcomes across Victoria.

### James' chance to say thanks after FAST saves his life



When James Bennett suffered a sudden stroke at home, his family's quick action and the expert care of paramedics Harley Gillion and Sal Singh saved his life.

Within 90 minutes, James regained full speech and mobility - a remarkable recovery made possible by fast recognition of the signs and seamless teamwork between AV and hospital staff.

Grateful for the care he received, James made a donation to AV to help others in similar situations. Every contribution, big or small, helps us invest in advanced training, specialised equipment, and innovative programs that give more Victorians the best chance of survival when every second counts.





Thanks to a \$6,500 donation from the Eva May Foundation in Mulwala, the Yarrawonga branch now has access to vital new training tools.

The funds are being used to purchase a paediatric resuscitation manikin, ECG rhythm generator, and cannulation training arm, giving local crews greater flexibility and access to specialised resources.

Donations like this that show how community support translates directly into better prepared paramedics and improved outcomes for local patients.

Paramedic educator Dylan Brittian said, "The generosity of the Eva May Foundation will make a world of difference to our local crews. This equipment will ensure our paramedics are prepared for any situation."

Eva May Foundation consultant Alistair McLellan added, "We see this as an excellent investment in the health and wellbeing of our local community, particularly during holiday periods when numbers swell."

On Thank a Paramedic Day, a Glen Waverley family reunited with the AV crews who came to their aid when their six-month-old daughter, Elara, suffered a severe allergic reaction to egg.

Paramedics Aimee Dwyer and Terri Hayden arrived within minutes, administering adrenaline and transporting Elara safely to hospital. "The paramedics' calm and reassuring presence made a big difference," her father Yohan recalled.

"They treated Elara with care and helped us feel safe and supported through it all."

To mark Elara's first birthday, the family made a \$500 donation in her name, continuing their

tradition of giving back on behalf of their children.

"It was important to us that this gift came from Elara," Yohan said. "One day she'll understand the role AV played in her early life."

Their generosity honours the care shown to Elara and helps fund the specialised tools and training paramedics need to save more lives.

#### Baw Baw creates impact through BBQs

Last year the Warragul and Neerim-Noojee Auxiliaries joined forces to create the Baw Baw Ambulance Auxiliary, bringing together dedicated volunteers from across the shire to support all AV branches in the region.

This newly formed group wasted no time getting started. Their first fundraiser, a Bunnings BBQ and Restart a Heart event held on 10 February was a great success, raising \$2000 and awareness about CPR and defibrillator use. Their enthusiasm was so well received that Bunnings immediately invited them back, leading to another community BBQ during Shocktober.

The merger has strengthened local fundraising efforts and created a united committee with greater reach across the community. By combining resources and volunteer energy, the Baw Baw Auxiliary is already making a meaningful impact in its first year.




